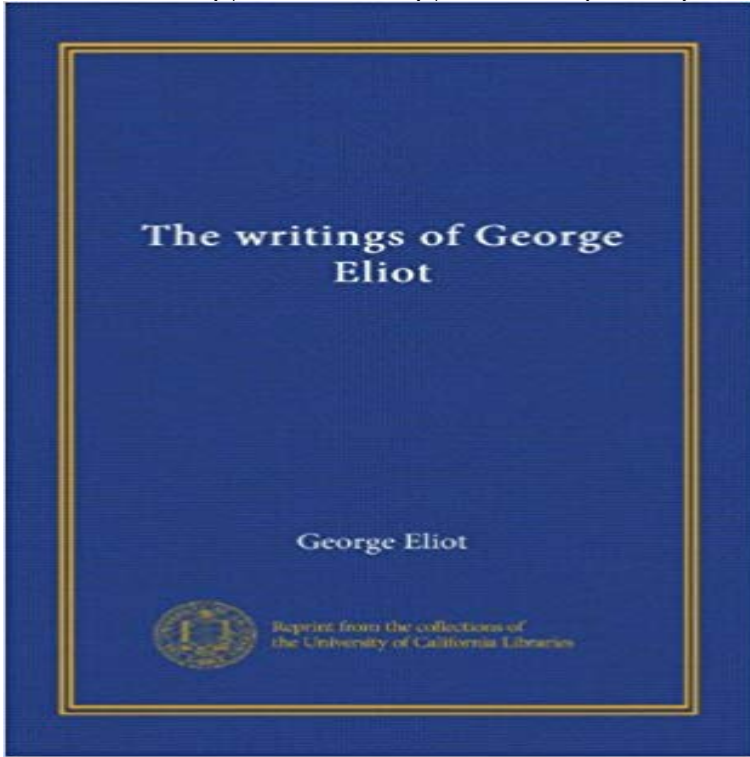


The writings of George Eliot (v.15)
